'Moanoghar Support Group' formed to raise funds for the Moanoghar Higher Education Loan Programme (HELP)

Following the celebrations of the 40 Anniversary, a sharing was organized on 13 March in Rangamati with the local civic leaders. Kirti Nishan Chakma, General Secretary, presented the key facts and figures about the current activities, including the budget and finances. Moanoghar. At the end of the meeting, a local support group -Moanoghar Support Group - was formed with Dr. Parash Khisa as Convenor and Mr. Bitu Chakma as Co-Convenor with 9 other members:

The Group was setup with the objectives of mobilizing public support to Moanoghar's activities in general and raise fund for the Moanoghar Higher Education Loan Programme (HELP), in particular. Currently, about 60 students are supported under HELP.

Moanoghar Celebrate 40th Anniversary

Moanoghar was founded in 1974. No one recorded the formal date of its foundation, yet everyone involved in the endeavour still vividly remembers how it all came into being. It was a long arduous journey, often made treacherous in the vortex that is the social, economic and political setting of the contemporary Chittagong Hill Tracts.

40 years is a milestone by any yardstick in the history of any institution. In Moanoghar's case, this is an all the more remarkable feat given the tumultuous past decades that the peoples in the region lived through.

The 40 anniversary were duly celebrated on 16 & 17 January 2015. The programme (see also in the following pages) was comprised of rendering homage to the founders and as well as individuals and organizations who have taken Moanoghar to this day.

The occasion was also the moment for reunion of the former students and residents and as well as the supporters and donors whose collaboration has been crucial to Moanoghar for this journey of 40 years. Together, they decided on a number of targets for the next 5 years for Moanoghar (see next page).

On the closing session, a number of distinguished persons were honoured for their contribution to CHT in various fields; namely, (1) Arts & Culture, (2) Education, (3) Women's rights and empowerment (4) Civic awareness and environmental conservation

The Key Targets for Next 5 Years

The following targets were decided for the next 5 years for Moanoghar in the reunion of the Moanogharians (alumnae of Moanoghar) during the 40 anniversary;

- 1. Improvement of the standard of education in Moanoghar School to make it among the top 5 schools in the greater Chittagong Hill Tracts.
- 2. Scale up the Higher Education Loan Programme (HELP) to reach the target of <u>at least 300 students over the next 4-5 years</u> under its coverage.
- 3. Set up a <u>Technical Vocational Trade School</u>. This is considered most urgent to impart key skills to students who (indeed most) would not be able to pursue higher education under HELP.
- 4. To continue with and expand Moanoghar's activities on the <u>preservation and promotion of the cultural heritage</u> of the region's indigenous minorities.
- 5. To <u>launch various income generating</u> activities with the objective of achieving at least 15-20% of the budgetary expenses from its own income sources over the next 5-6 years.
- 6. To expand outreach activities in 3 key areas across the 3 Hill Districts; education, environmental conservation and regeneration, and women's empowerment.

The Annual Sport Day of Moanoghar School was celebrated on 28 February 2015. The prizes were distributed to the winners in a ceremony in presence of the Deputy Commissioner, Rangamati Hill District and Chairman, Rangamati Sadar Upazilla, respectively as Chief Guest and Guest of Honour (See above also), held on 4 March 2015.

• New Admission in 2015

This year, in total 203 new children were admitted at Moanoghar as residential students. Because of lack of room in the residential hostels and school classrooms, more than 550 children were refused admission in Moanoghar. This was a very difficult situation for Moanoghar; all these children come from remote areas across the region where there are no functional schools and from its past experiences Moanoghar knows that, in most cases, these children will not be able to continue further schooling.

An Appeal

Moanoghar makes <u>URGENT APPEAL</u> to its generous individuals, organizations and its friends and allies to help us in the following initiatives;

• Installation of LED bulbs

Moanoghar has recently made an estimate to install LED bulbs in all the residential hostels (12 in total), School Building complex (3 buildings) and other assorted buildings and installations e.g. administrative office, mini hospital, library building etc. (in total 6 buildings). The total cost is about 3.5 million taka. Although the initial investment may seem relatively high, Moanoghar will be able to recoup the amount in about 6 years, with a monthly savings of 50% on its electricity bill. The bulbs come with a warranty of 12 years. At present, Moanoghar pays a monthly electricity bill of 100,000 taka – 120,000 taka.

• Computer & IT Equipments

Moanoghar runs a computer lab for teaching the children IT skills. The current equipments are, however, almost obsolete with most of the PCs more than 6-8 years old. We appeal your support to procure 35 PCs, 2 laptops, 1 printer and 1 multimedia projector. The total budget is 1.6 million taka.

• Sponsorship of Children
